

since its publication in 1962 carlos fuentes novel aura remains not merely an object of academic interest but a continuous source of controversy in mexico it was the explosive combination of sex and religion that incensed the ministro de hacienda salvador abascal and linked aura to the recent polemical mexican film el crimen del padre amaro aura is preoccupied with the place and persistence of the sacred in modern mexico rather than simply the secret abuses of institutional catholicism this critical edition of the work is accompanied by an introduction and notes on the text

doubles and hybrids in latin american gothic focuses on a recurrent motif that is fundamental in the gothic the double this volume explores how this ancient notion acquires tremendous force in a region latin america which is itself defined by duplicity indigenous european autochthonous religions catholic despite this duplicity and at the same time because of it this region has also generated mestizaje or forms resulting from racial mixing and hybridity this collection then aims to contribute to the current discussion about the gothic in latin america by examining the doubles and hybrid forms that result

the latin american novel burst onto the international literary scene with the boom era led by julio cortázar gabriel garcía márquez carlos fuentes and mario vargas llosa and has influenced writers throughout the world ever since garcía márquez and vargas llosa each received the nobel prize in literature and many of the best known contemporary novelists are inspired by the region s fiction indeed magical realism the style associated with garcía márguez has left a profound imprint on african american african asian anglophone caribbean and latinx writers furthermore post boom literature continues to garner interest from the novels of roberto bolaño to the works of césar aira and chico buarque to those of younger novelists such as juan gabriel vásquez alejandro zambra and valeria luiselli yet for many readers the latin american novel is often read in a piecemeal manner delinked from the traditions authors and social contexts that help explain its evolution the oxford handbook of the latin american novel draws literary historical and social connections so that readers will come away understanding this literature as a rich and compelling canon in forty five chapters by leading and innovative scholars the handbook provides a comprehensive introduction helping readers to see the region s intrinsic heterogeneity for only with a broader view can one fully appreciate garcía márquez or bolaño this volume charts the literary tradition of the latin american novel from its beginnings during colonial times its development during the nineteenth and the first half of the twentieth century and its flourishing from the 1960s onward furthermore the handbook explores the regions representations of identity narrative trends and authors that make this literature so diverse and fascinating reflecting on the latin american novel s position in world literature

one of the primary objectives of comparative literature is the study of the relationship of texts also known as intertextuality which is a means of contextualizing and analyzing the way literature grows and flourishes through inspiration and imitation direct or indirect when the inspiration and imitation is direct and obvious the study of this rapport falls into the more restricted category of hypertextuality what the author has labeled a cryptic subtext however is an extreme case of hypertextuality it involves a series of allusions to another text that have been deliberately inserted by the author into the primary text as potential points of reference this book takes a deep dive into a broad array of literature and film to explore these allusions and the hidden messages therein

published in 1499 and centered on the figure of a bawd and witch fernando de rojas dark and disturbing celestina was destined to become the most suppressed classic in spanish literary history routinely ignored in spanish letters the book nonetheless echoes through contemporary spanish and latin american literature this is the phenomenon that celestina s brood explores roberto gonzález echevarría one of the most eminent and influential critics of hispanic literature writing today uses rojas text as his starting point to offer an exploration of modernity in the hispanic literary tradition and of the baroque as an expression of the modern his analysis of celestina reveals the relentless probing of the limits of language and morality that mark the work as the beginning of literary modernity in spanish and the start of a tradition distinguished by a penchant for the excesses of the baroque gonzález echevarría pursues this tradition and its meaning through the works of major figures such as cervantes lope de vega calderón de la barca alejo carpentier carlos fuentes gabriel garcía márquez

with the publication of la maravilla 1993 alfredo véa entered the world of letters in full possession of his craft as a novelist blending narrative fiction and engaging anecdotes with allusions to art music paintings poetry and autobiography e g his tour of duty in vietnam written in the poetry and prose of the world with penetrating reflections on america as an ideal and the united states as a country véa s narrative trilogy was recognized for its attention to language ingenious conception at the level of plot and theme and broad reflections on american society its history politics art religion the entertainment industry and its role as a world power in the twentieth century specifically during the vietnam war although recognized as a writer of great intuition and exceptional creativity until now no book length study has been written on alfredo véa as a novelist in this book each one of the novels in the trilogy is analyzed and interpreted from an interdisciplinary perspective and with the general reader in mind as well as college and university professors and students of us and world literatures
